



for whom?

SINCE JANUARY 2018, ALL MIGRANTS WILL BE OBLIGATED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PATHWAYS WHO:

- register with a municipality of the German-speaking community as of 1 January 2018 and
- who have a residence permit for at least 3 months and
- who are of age

EXCEPTIONS ARE:

- Persons, who have the citizenship of another EU-country, of a country within the European economic area, or of Switzerland, as well as their family members
- Enrolled pupils or students
- Persons with a Belgian high school diploma
- Persons at the retirement age (≥ 65 years)
- Persons with a workpermit
- Persons, who cannot regularly attend the integration classes due to an illness or a handicap (with certificate)
- Diplomats, professional athletes or the personnel of international organisations
- Persons, who have been living in Belgium for more than 3 years.
- Persons who have a certificate of participation of another integration programme of another federated entity recognized by the German-speaking community.

THE INTEGRATION PATHWAYS AIMS AT:

- all persons of age, who come from a foreign country and who live in a municipality of the German-speaking community.
- Asylum seekers: 4 months after the application.

- To gain access to job search and training programmes

SOCIAL ASSESSMENT

During a first interview at Info-Integration, the person will be asked questions about their skills, family situation and objectives (social assessment).

The steps of the **integration pathways**, which ought to be completed, will be determined with a social worker of Info Integration.

At the end of the interview, an agreement will be signed.

It is compulsory for some, others however are allowed to participate voluntarily.

People, who have signed the agreement, but who do not regularly attend the courses, may be issued a fine.

LANGUAGE COURSE

First, the person undergoes an evaluation test and then joins the course that best suits its level.

The goal of the language class is for the participants to attain basic knowledge of the language and to be able to communicate in their daily lives. *(Level A2 of the Common European Framework for Reference for Languages)*

IS THE INTEGRATION PATHWAYS COMPULSORY?

INTEGRATION COURSE

The course consists of 60 hours and includes information about the values in our society and the rights and duties of a citizen.

CERTIFICATE

SOCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL INFORMATION

Info-Integration gives, according to the skills and interests of the migrant, initial information relating to education and profession.

Info Integration can also help to find sports activities, hobbies and volunteer activities.

Once people reach the end of the integration programme, they receive a certificate.

IMPORTANT: the person must have attended at least 80% of the integration and language course.
